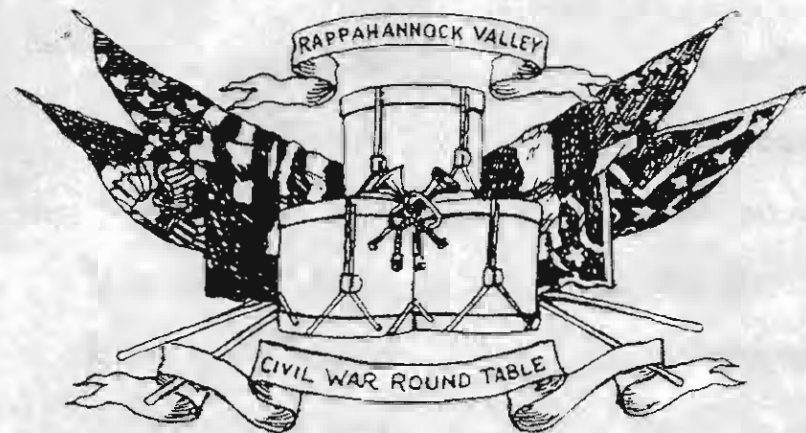

## History of the Round Table

The Rappahannock Valley Civil War Round Table was founded in 1989 as an organization open to all people interested in learning about the Civil War and in preserving the hallowed ground where the soldiers fought. We hold monthly meetings on the second Monday of each month which feature dinner, a short business meeting, a speaker, a book raffle and time to socialize with friends. Over the last fifteen years, the group has grown to over 135 members.

In addition to our educational programs at the monthly meetings, we have taken field trips to such places as Gettysburg, Second Manassas, Antietam, Cold Harbor, Chickamauga, Charleston and the Shenandoah Valley. The round table has also been active in promoting battlefield preservation. We have raised and donated about \$25,000 to organizations including Central Virginia Battlefields Trust, The Association for the Preservation of Civil War Sites, Civil War Preservation Trust and Brandy Station Foundation.
